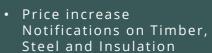

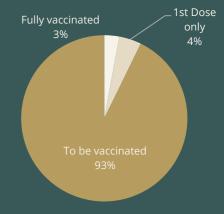

- 2,500 workers moved abroad for work (IPCA)

- Next Phase of UK Import Controls delayed by 6 months

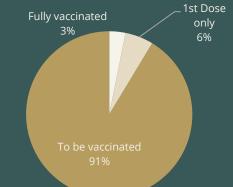

- 5th April *likely* for residential restart
- 2-3 weeks later for nonresidential





- · Vaccination programme much slower than expected (9,750 pers./day)
- At 40,000 pers./day it would take until Nov 21 to be fully vaccinated



BREXIT & SUPPLY CHAIN



 Goods imports from Britain fell by 65% in January, down €906m



 Goods imports from EU decreased by 13%, while exports to EU countries decreased by 23%





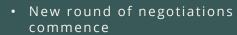

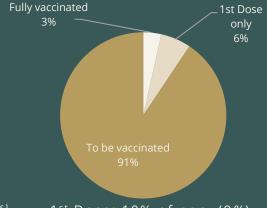

- 4th May likely for remainder of industry but dates to be confirmed towards end of April

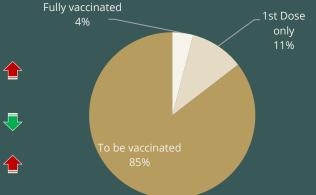

- Contractors very frustrated at partial reopening

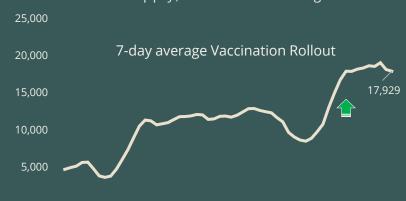


 4th May likely for remainder of industry but dates to be confirmed towards end of April

- Likely to be teething issues for a couple of weeks with labour and supplies



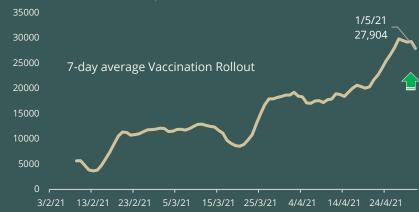

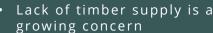

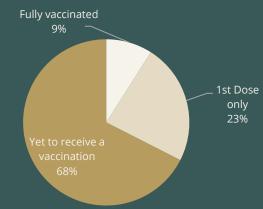
